comforts and some personal desires.

God will never demand anything that He has not already given his people. The principle of **coetera tolle** connotes sacrifice but it can also mean "gift". Everything a missionary can hold onto in the mission lands is a gift. In the same manner, everything that a missionary is, is his gift to Jesus.

- 1. Leave everything behind "Distacco". Start all over again. We are SOJOURNERS. We are PILGRIMS.
- 2. Be discerning on things that are essential. Learn how to disregard non-essential things.
- 3. Amaze yourself and rouse those around you to the potential of each new day.
- 4. Live detachment concretely. Look with hope to the horizon of today, for today is all we truly have. Past no longer there. Future not yet there.
- 5. Don't be afraid to admit that you are less than perfect; this is the essence of one's humanity. It is the beginning of leaving everything behind.

6. The outlook on life depends on the way one look at things. We can only use things, not abuse them. We are only caretakers not owners. (Principle of Stewardship)
