Dear Brother and Sister Salesians:

The week beginning this Sunday, January 8-14, 2012, is **National Migration Week** in Catholic USA. And that is precisely the area of the Rector Major's fourth and final orientation for our Region at the conclusion of the El Salvador Team Visit: immigration.

The fact that there are fifty million Hispanic migrants in the United States, as well as the great impact on the millions of young people in countries south of the border, demands of the InterAmerica Region a Salesian response. In most of the provinces of our Region there already is sufficient attention given to young people who have parents or other family members who have left to migrate to the US. But the Region is being called to a greater practical and Salesian pastoral care for immigrants "al norte."

One big motivation for greater practical effort here is an ecclesial consciousness. These immigrants in the US are on the poorest fringes of society and they have the right to continue their path of faith in their new country. Another big motivation is a charismatic one. From the time of the first missionary expedition, Don Bosco was preoccupied with

immigrants, sending his Salesians not only to the native people of Patagonia, but also to accompany the Italian immigrants in Argentina.

And the Rector Major then gives another motivation. "The accompaniment of immigrants is a form of responsible participation in the **pastoral sensitivity of the SDB's of the United States**, who are already attending to our Latino brothers and sisters and request the collaboration of the Latino provinces. It is a consequence of the composition of the Region and of the necessity to seek an institutional response to global problems."

He then asks that a Regional Project of Salesian commitment in the field of immigration be prepared by the Regional Councilor and a corresponding commission and that it be taken up by the provinces in their pastoral and organic plans.

If the Rector Major is challenging our brothers in the other provinces of the Region to a greater awareness of this reality in the US Church and to a greater pastoral commitment, how much more must we here grow in this pastoral sensitivity and open our hearts and our doors to the immigrant, to the stranger among us. The theme of this year's National Migration Week is "Welcoming Christ in the Migrant." We call ourselves as a province to just that in the fifth priority of our own organic plan.

(ANS - Rome) - For the Salesian Family, 2012 is a year dedicated to going back to the life story of Don Bosco and coming to know it better. As is his custom, the Rector Major officially presented the Strenna at the Generalate of the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians. At the simple but heartfelt occasion among those present were Mother Yvonne Reungoat, the Councillors, Fr Alberto Lorenzelli, Provincial of Central Italy and some other Salesians and members of the Salesian Family.

The Strenna for 2012, which the Rector Major entrusts to the Salesian Family, continues along the lines he gave to the Salesians in view of the Bicentenary of the birth of Don Bosco (1815-2015) and officially launched on 16 August. The 28 groups of the Salesian Family are being called to come to know in depth the life story of Don Bosco in order to re-

present his image today and to continue the mission entrusted to them: the education and the evangelisation of the young.



**Shivta**

The prosperity of Shivta in the Byzantine period (especially on the 5th - 7th c. CE) was founded on extensive and highly developed agriculture as well as economic activities in relation with Christian pilgrim.

The impressive remains of the city includes three Christian churches (later a Muslim mosque as well), residential areas, large courtyards and public squares, administrative buildings, streets and small lanes creating an elaborate urban network.

Wine-presses, terraces, and various remains of agricultural structures and of complex irrigation system were visible in the city and its surroundings.

## Shivta National Park

The City of Shivta or Sobota or Subeitah or Subaytah (in Hebrew) is an archaeological site in the Negev Desert of Israel, east of Nitzana.

It has been long considered that together with its sister-cities, Avdat and Mamshit, the city of Shivta began as a caravan stop in the Negev for the Nabatean masters of the Incense Route, and flourished after Christianity, during the Byzantine period, came to the Negev in the fourth century.

However, the new assessment of modern archeologist is based on an analysis of the irrigation system found at the site, which



bears parallels to Byzantine structures elsewhere made considering the possibility that the town was actually a Byzantine agricultural colony. and a way station for pilgrims en route to the Santa Catarina, Egypt, (possible route for the Holy Family towards |

Egypt) located on the supposed site of Mount Sinai.

After the Arab conquest in the 7th Century CE, Shivta began to decline in population. It was finally abandoned in the 8th or 9th Century CE.

Shivta's people were mainly farmers, who carefully collected every rare drop of rain because of its scarcity around its desert terrain. Its two churches, still visible (along with a cruciform baptismal font), were magnets for pilgrims. A modern-day orchard north of the site utilizes ancient methods to raise various fruits.




City's Water Systems for the purpose of collecting rainwater and distribution throughout the city.



