

Dear Brother and Sister Salesians:

Last Saturday was an important day in the life of the province. We gathered together all the directors, pastors, school presidents and principals, club executive directors, CYM's, and other province leaders. Throughout the day, so beautifully hosted for us by the community of St. Joseph's Novitiate and Youth Renewal Center, we reflected on the why and how to do pastoral planning at each of our sites, the why and wherefore of the CYM in each of our works, and the need for regular common formation both at the local level (led by the director or pastor or CYM) and at the province level ("S" programs).

Then on Sunday we paused to honor those SDB within our province community who are observing a jubilee of profession and/or ordination in 2011. The Mass was wonderful at St. Dominic Savio, as well as the buffet dinner afterwards. I think it rejuvenated all of us to see so many young people and families at the Mass, and also to take note of the long years of faithful and joyful perseverance of our jubilarian Salesians, who have decided, by the profession of vows and the sacrament of Holy Orders, to "stay with Don Bosco." And stay with Don Bosco they have, beginning with Brother Zanella who this year observes 75 years as an SDB! How heartwarming it was to

hear their stories and their gratitude to God for the vocation they have received. And those who were there will never forget the toast raised by young Sean Roche on behalf of all the young people these men have served over the years.

At the same dinner we saw the premier of We Are Salesian, an engaging DVD record of the visit of Don Bosco's relics last year to our province. Far more than a nostalgic photo collection, this DVD is a lasting formative tool for all of us. It will recall how last year's visit of Don Bosco to California still challenges us to be Salesian, or better, to be Don Bosco for the young. Communities will each receive one copy free, and then other copies are available for purchase from the Social Communications Office. Immense gratitude to Judy Alvarez, her team, and to Jim and Linda Roche who put it all together.

Next day it was more meetings, this time for the directors and pastors alone. We too need time to step aside and reflect on our role within the Salesian family and to offer advice and counsel to the provincial on the many financial and pastoral challenges facing the province these days. How do we bring to everyday life what our Rule calls us to do when it says that "The rector represents Christ who unites his followers in the service of the Father" (C 55)? Then a good part of the day was a careful presentation of our Province Organic Plan (POP) just recently approved, and highly praised (!), by the Rector Major and his council. With a clear fundamental direction for our personal, community, and provincial decisions and plans, we can be firmly on the road to returning to Don Bosco and rekindling his charism here in the West.

On September 14, 2011 many people gathered at the Parish Hall for a meeting to bring awareness of safety and security for the parish and the neighborhood. The discussion focused mainly on safety for the youth and adults, especially in light of a recent break-in at Corpus Christi and other nearby acts of violence. Captain Daniel Mahoney of the San Francisco Ingleside Police Station was in attendance.

I felt that this meeting was important. It was a spark in making the vision of creating a safer environment a reality for all who come to the Don Bosco Oratory set here at Corpus Christi. Our main concern for our youth ministry is that all youth members are able to

come and go in a safe manner, especially in the evening when things are done. During the meeting members gave their testimonies of violent acts that had occurred around the neighborhood. This violence has definitely affected the attendance at our youth nights. Parents discourage their children from traveling alone at night to and from Corpus Christi.


